Assisting Native Americans whose disabilities result in barriers to find employment, succeed at work and live independently in Nooksack, Sauk-Suiattle, Stillaguamish, Swinomish, Tulalip, and Upper Skagit Tribal communities.

Eligibility Criteria

- Enrolled in a Federally Recognized Tribe;
 - Ages 16* and older;
 - Living in the NIVRP service area;
(Whatcom, Skagit, and Snohomish Counties)
- Have a physical or mental impairment that is preventing you from getting or maintaining employment.
